

The steps to fund projects

1 Identify Projects

24 Jun – 12 Jul

Meetings to identify community projects, understand their goals and who they support, map out approximate costings.

The result:

A list of projects to be considered for funding, nominated by the Tumbarumba community.

2 Prioritise projects

21 Aug

Collaboration session where community members work together to prioritise the projects in line with investment categories.

Tumbarumba Bowling Club, 5.30pm

The result:

A list of projects, in priority order, to be considered for funding.

3 Funding

22 Aug – 6 Sept

Lumea approves project funding, informed by collaboration session and total requested budget.

The result:

Project owners advised which projects will be funded.

4 Delivering

6 Sept onwards

Lumea works with projects to finalise contracts and set up monitoring plans. Support provided during delivery if needed.

The result:

Community projects delivered.

Eligibility

Delivery organisations must:

Be a not-for-profit organisation

Be located in, or delivering services to, the Tumbarumba community.

Hold an ABN or be supported during the grant by an incorporated not-for-profit organisation

Applications from the following will not be eligible:

For-profit organisations or activities

Government entities

Trusts or philanthropic organisations (to fund their general objectives).

Eligibility

Projects must:

Provide a lasting and tangible benefit to the Tumbarumba community

Be delivered within the relevant timeframe

Organisations can apply separately for multiple initiatives. Each project will be assessed individually

Non-eligible initiatives

Funding will not be provided to initiatives that:

- are the responsibility of local, State or Federal Government
- are for travel or conference attendance (unless incidental to a funded project)
- have a religious, political, or sectarian purpose
- are endowments, memorial, or academic chairs
- comprise retrospective costs
- comprise general maintenance or overhead expenses (unless part of a specific project)
- are general fundraising appeals
- are reliant upon ongoing support from Lumea to be sustainable
- are outside of the Tumbarumba geographic area

Timing

Timing for delivery of projects will depend on the amount of funding provided:

Up to \$10,000 –

Funding used within 6 months

\$10,001 to \$50,000 –

Funding used within 12 months

\$50,001 to \$250,000 –

Funding used within 2 years

Categories

Each project will need to demonstrate how it connects with one or more of these themes:

Community connection

Care for country

Emergency response and preparation

Economic growth and tourism
